

Spring Board Report

Intensity. Camaraderie. Amazement. Controversy (although darn little). And definitely, **Tenacity**. We worked, we laughed, we struggled, we endured and we accomplished.

Your Board of Directors, along with 28 other Ninety-Nines met on March 2 and 3, at our Headquarters in Oklahoma City amidst the usual wind and chilly temperatures typical of that season. However, all can agree they weren't chilled in the boardroom; rather the input of every individual is encouraged and appreciated, no matter their title or role. Five 99s experienced both their first BOD meeting and their first foray into our headquarters. Amazement was the word. (Ed. Note: Look for a first timer's account in an upcoming 99 News.)

And, you will be amazed and pleased with the accomplishments of the Trusts. Our Endowment Fund is now 35% of the way toward its initial goal of *one million dollars*. We are really on a roll and encourage chapters, sections and individuals to continue their generosity. Meanwhile, the AEMSF has been the recipient of some very generous bequests, bringing their assets to near \$3,000,000. And then there are our museums. The MWP has instituted an 'Adopt the Museum for a Day' program. For a \$125 contribution, your name or that of your designated honoree will be featured in the museum and a certificate will be mailed to the designee. It makes a fabulous gift. And, the Collections Room now has the most unbelievable shelving system, allowing intensive use of the climate controlled room with a floor that can handle more tonnage than Ringling Brothers' elephants. Pat Prentiss worked long and hard on this project and the payoff begins this year. The AE Birthplace Museum in Atchison, Kansas, touted record attendance in October 2006. The trustees are focused on the summer festivities of the Forest of Friendship and the Amelia Earhart Festival, along with developing plans for funding a new roof.

Membership is now more than 5,400 and growing. President Prentiss has accepted Past President Gene Nora Jessen's challenge to attain 6,000 by August 2008. It's very doable. You'll be reading more from Anne Marie Radel and Sharon Blodinger, membership committee co-chairs on how we are going to meet this challenge.

Finances at Headquarters are sound. The line of credit has been paid off yet remains available if necessary. Significant donations toward specified projects have been received from Vee Gordon and the Mid-Atlantic Section. None of these donations can be used toward day-to-day operations and your board members continue to do their work with no budgeted funds to offset their expenses. Frugality remains the keyword at our Headquarters. The Nintey-Nines, Inc. received a bequest from an estate toward improving our website. Webmaster Pamela O'Brien is ecstatic and developing a plan to upgrade and add more functionality to the website that will make the most of the better than \$100,000 donation.

Our Headquarters Office Manager, Laura Ohrenberg, officially took her new position on March 3rd and welcomes hearing from you and helping you with any questions or concerns regarding membership or other matters.

We accepted the bid from the Southwest Section to host the 2010 International Conference on the Big Island of Hawaii. Dates in July are to be determined. So, it's Denver/Boulder, September 12-16, this year, then Anchorage in August 2008 and Chicago in July 2009.

All are invited to come to these Board of Directors meetings. The next one will be September 12 at the International Conference, or come to Oklahoma City for the Fall meeting on November 1-3. We'd love to see you!

Mary Magee, 67, died on March 23, 2007, at her home in Santa Cruz after a long and courageous battle with cancer.

Mary was born in Anderson, Indiana on January 13, 1940, moving with her family to California in 1943. After graduating from Santa Cruz High School in 1957, she worked as an office manager for the Santa Cruz Chamber of Commerce. Later, she entered the car business, working for Bill O'Riley Plymouth, and then Bob Bowman Volkswagen in Santa Cruz. Mary transitioned into sales becoming one of the first female sales representatives for Kraft Foods. She retired from Kraft after 24 years in 1996.

Adventurous and energetic, Mary enjoyed many types of sports including sailing; snow skiing, tennis, golf, and flying. Her favorite ski destination was Whistler Ski Resort in Canada. Taking up tennis after the age 50, Mary joined the Santa Cruz Tennis Club, and played in many tournaments.

An avid golfer, Mary was a member of the Pajaro Valley Golf Club and the DeLaveaga Ladies Club. One of her proudest achievements was sinking a Hole in One on the 3rd hole at the PV Golf Course on 8/1/06 during a weekly tournament. Striving to be the best at whatever activity she undertook, Mary was overjoyed when she reached her lowest score of 79 at Pajaro Valley Golf Club.

In the 1980s while working for Kraft Foods, a good friend and business associate was moving to Southern California. To maintain the friendship, and being creative as well as practical, the two friends decided to learn to fly so they could easily stay in touch by alternately flying to visit on the weekends. Shortly after earning her Pilots License, Mary purchased a 1976 Beechcraft Sundowner and then went on to earn her Instrument Rating as well. Her longest flight was to Atlantic City, New Jersey and her most interesting trip was to Copper Canyon, Mexico. For many years she was a member of the Monterey Bay Chapter.

Most people will remember Mary for her enthusiasm for life and sense of humor. She enjoyed good food, good friends, and good wine. She will be greatly missed.
