# **Scholarship Program**

The Monterey Bay chapter of The Ninety-Nines International Organization of Women Pilots is offering one \$1000 scholarship to a local woman. It is either to be used by the recipient to obtain her private pilot license or to obtain an advanced rating to further her pursuit of a career in aviation.

### Eligibility

1. The Student applicant must be in good health and not dependent on medication or have any other disqualifying condition. The Advanced applicant must have a current medical certificate, appropriate to the rating she seeks.

2. The applicant must live in Santa Cruz or Monterey County.

3. If the applicant is already a licensed pilot, she must have completed any necessary written exams, have a current flight review or equivalent, and have all ratings prerequisite to the rating she seeks before money is awarded, but not necessarily before application. Otherwise, she must have completed the private written exam before money is awarded, but not necessarily before application.

4. The applicant, if less than 18 years of age, may elect to use the scholarship for ground school instruction expenses or have the money held until she is 18 years of age for flight instruction expenses.

5. If not already a licensed pilot, applicant must be proficient in English.

6. The applicant must demonstrate a financial need for the scholarship.

7. Applications must be postmarked by the application deadline, December 31, 2015.

At our last meeting, Joanne was passing out airplane cookie cutters to those members who would like to make airplane cookies for the Hospitality Room for our Section Meeting. In keeping with that subtle hint to start baking those cookies, here are some recipes you can try if you don't have any. Just about any cookie can be frozen and thawed right before the conference. With that said, "Let's start propping."

## **BUTTER COOKIE AIRPLANES**

OR

OR

Recipe #1 Makes 4 dozen

3 Cups flour
2 sticks salted butter
1 Cup sugar
1 large egg
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 teaspoon baking powder
3 Tablagagan milk

3 Tablespoon milk

Recipe #3

Makes 2 dozen

4 Cups sifted flour
2 sticks unsalted butter
2 Cups sugar
2 large eggs
2 teaspoon vanilla
1 teaspoon baking powder
½ teaspoon salt

Recipe #2 Makes 5 dozen

2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Cups flour
1 stick butter or margarine
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Cup sugar
1 extra-large egg
1 teaspoon vanilla

<u>Recipe #4</u> (Biscochitos) (New Mexico's state cookie)

Makes 2 dozen

3 Cups flour

1 1/4 Cups lard or vegetable shortening

1 Cup sugar Plus <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Cup for sprinkling

1 large egg

1 teaspoon vanilla

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon baking powder

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon salt

2 Tablespoon orange-flavored liqueur such Grand Marnier or triple sec

2 teaspoon anise seeds

2 Tablespoon water

 $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon cinnamon

Zest of 1 orange (finely grated)

Directions for #1 recipe

- 1. Heat oven to  $400^{\circ}$
- 2. Beat butter & sugar in bowl until creamy. Beat in egg & vanilla.
- 3. Mix baking powder & flour in bowl. On low speed, gradually beat flour mixture into butter mixture until combined. Add milk; beat until dough masses around beaters, 2 minutes
- 4. Cover dough with plastic wrap and put into refrigerator to make dough harder and easier to handle. Divide dough into thirds. Keep the other dough refrigerated until ready to use.
- 5. Lightly flour a clean work surface. Roll out each third of dough to 1/3" thickness. Use airplane cookie cutters or make your own airplane pattern by tracing a plane's silhouette onto a cardboard and use that as a pattern to trace and cut into the dough. Sprinkle with color sugar or sprinkles prior to baking.
- 6. Bake in 400° oven for 10 minutes on ungreased baking pan.

Directions for #2 recipe

- 1. Follow above directions except...
- 2. Roll out dough  $\frac{1}{4}$ " thick
- 3. Heat oven to 375° and bake 10-15 minutes or until edges turn golden, not brown.

#### Directions for #3 recipe

- 1. Follow directions for recipe #2 except...
- 2. Preheat oven to 325° and bake cookies for 15 to 18 minutes.
- 3. After cooled, can decorate with Royal icing.

Directions for #4 recipe

- 1. Combine  $\frac{3}{4}$  Cup sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl and set aside.
- 2. Follow directions for recipe #2 except...
- 3. After cutting out airplane shapes, lightly sift sugar/cinnamon mixtures onto all the planes.
- 4. Place on parchment-lined baking sheet and freeze until dough is very firm, about 15 minutes.
- 5. Bake 12 to 14 minutes and rotate cookie sheet about 7 minutes later.

How to freeze cookies

- 1. Put into a container that can be sealed and free from contamination. Containers keep the cookies from breaking if stored in containers versus plastic bags. Freeze.
- 2. Use within 3 to 6 months.
- 3. Thaw for 1 to 2 hours at room temperature

## **ROYAL ICING**

(Makes 2 1/2C)

1 pound confectioners' sugar, sifted 5 Tablespoons meringue powder (can purchase at Michael's) Scant ½ Cup water

- 1. Combine all ingredients in the bowl of electric mixer fitted with paddle attachment. Mix on low speed until smooth, about 7 minutes.
- 2. If icing is too thick, add more water; if too thin, beat icing 2 to 3 minutes more or add more confectioners' sugar a tablespoon at a time.
- 3. Use icing immediately, or store in an airtight container up to 2 days (icing hardens quickly when exposed to air).
- 4. Beat well with a rubber spatula before using.

## 1. NOT SURE HOW COOKIES WITH ROYAL ICING WILL FREEZE

2. Can customize your dough to your own taste by adding a hint of cinnamon, grated lemon zest, bit of brandy, Jell-O for color or flavor, or other flavors or extracts.
