The Amelia Earhart Memorial Fund Scholarship Trustees are pleased to announce that the **2010 Scholarship and Awards Application forms** are now on the 99s website, <u>http://www.ninety-</u>

<u>nines.org/</u>. From the Home Page, look under ResourceCenter. Then click on the AE Memorial Scholarships button.

There are separate instructions for each of the six types of awards, including four varieties of Amelia Earhart Scholarships, the Maule Tailwheel Training award, and the New Pilot Award. We look forward to receiving your 2010 applications.

Hello Chapter Chairs and Chapter Officers,

I need your help and your input! The 99s give out awards at our annual conference. In 2010, we have expanded the Award of Achievement to three different categories. Three separate Awards of Achievement may be presented each year. The three awards are:

a. The <u>Award of Achievement for Contributions to The Ninety-Nines</u> – which recognizes a significant contribution to the mission of the 99s or any of the organization's activities.

b. The <u>Award of Achievement for Contributions to Aviation</u> – recognizes significant contributions to any facet of aviation, such as aviation/aerospace education, aviation science, aviation history, aviation commerce, aviation legislation, etc.
c. The <u>Award of Achievement for Humanitarian Efforts</u> – which recognizes significant contribution, through aviation, in a humanitarian effort.

In addition, two other awards may be presented to "non-99s." The first one, the <u>George Palmer Putnam Award</u>, is given in recognition of support of The 99s. The other award, the <u>Award of Merit</u>, is given to recognize a contribution(s) made to aviation in general. Each of these awards may be presented to an individual or an organization. Individual winners may be male or female.

I am sure that you know several people or groups that deserve special recognition. Recipients may be living or deceased and from any country. The contribution may have occurred at any time in the past or present, as a single action or a series of events.

The nominating requirements are very simple:

A. Nominations may be submitted by any individual or group within The Ninety-Nines.

B. The nomination should be in the form of a one-page letter and up to three additional pages of substantiating material. The name, address and phone number of the nominee or the nominee's next of kin, if the nominee is deceased, should be included.

C. The nomination should give complete, but concise, details justifying the award to the nominee with such background information as considered pertinent, and any other relevant information that would assist the Awards Committee.

D. Nominations from previous years may be resubmitted.

E. Nominations should be sent to The Ninety-Nines Headquarters to the attention of the Awards Committee.

F. Nominations may be submitted by electronic transmission (fax or email) or by post. The nomination must be received on or before **January 15, 2010**.

New Horizons

Ronald Ellis Harmon, 77, beloved husband of MB99 Kay Harmon and cherished father of Beverly, Lynn Carol and Dianne, passed away Friday, Nov. 13, 2009, after a nearly five year valiant battle with prostate cancer. He was at home, with his wife and daughters, Beverly and Lynn, at his bedside.

Ron was born July 27, 1932, in Hollister. During World War II, he traveled with his family to Army Air Bases in Southern California, Texas and Utah where his father was a flight instructor with the Army Air Corps. Following WW II, the family returned to Hollister where his father established Harmon Flying Service at Hollister Airport. He met his wife to be Kay Ackerman at age 12, while his father used a dirt strip off Fairview Road until he could begin operation at the Hollister Airport. On Oct. 25th, they celebrated their 59th wedding anniversary. Ron earned his pilot's license at age 16 by fueling and washing airplanes, and his love for aviation continued after he and Kay married. He also inspired Kay and his youngest daughter Dianne to learn to fly. Ron and Kay made many trips to all Western and Southwestern states, and to British Columbia, visiting family in Arizona and Utah.


