



If you haven't been to the Winter Workshop it's a one day meeting. This year our theme is "Secrets to a Successful Chapter".

We will discuss tips to make your meetings more exciting and activities to get your members more involved.

Dec. 4, 2018 Airport Business Plan (Reid Hillview), Item #19 (by Jeanne)

The hearings over the issue of keeping Reid Hillview open lasted for 4 hours. The room was packed, mostly by proponents of keeping Reid Hillview Airport open. 75 speakers most of whom were in favor of keeping RHV spoke. They included numerous SJSU Aeronautical students, parents, EAA, Young Eagle, Angel Flight, DART pilots, representatives from FAA, NASA, SJSU aeronautical department, private pilots, flight instructors, FBO owners and others. Their speeches were passionate and heartfelt. Opponents were from the local airport neighborhoods, First 5, schools, citizen's groups and various community action groups. At one point there were some finger-pointing bringing up examples of a few privileged pilots verses a low-class communities, the haves and have nots, and people of color being victimized. Supervisor Simitian was able to gently keep the controversies under control and redirect speakers and audiences to respect one another's view-points and keep comments to themselves.

The situation that led to this hearing is the fact that Reid Hillview has been loosing money yearly and is in serious debit. The Roads and Airport representative, County Airport presenters worked to gather information about the financial health of the airport for a year. What they found was there was a staffing decline, costs increased faster than revenue, leases are due for renewal (RHV in 2021 and San Martin in 2020) and the airport was not accepting news leases and companies were not approaching the airport to begin a lease due to the uncertainty of the airport. Maintenance was also a factor adding to the financial strains. The numbers of based aircraft have diminished which added to the loss of revenue.

Another issue was the lead detected in the air around the airport and in local communities. According to a lead monitor at the airport, airborne lead is below the Federal and State threshold yet other reports, including the San Jose Mercury News state that lead levels are high and that Reid Hillview was placed 25th highest on the list of all the airports with lead issues. Most likely the low lead fuel contributes.

The following are some of the points that were brought up from both "sides:"


- Emergency management use—needs land around various airports to provide quick response time. Need regional airport for staging during emergency.
- Need housing now but closing the airport won't help with housing issues. Taking away aviation department from SJSU if airport is closed. Will end program for SJSU. Students will have to go to San Martin for classes. Distance & relocation to San Martin is too far and makes no sense.
- RHV is considered a reliever airport to SJS & SFO. RHV took FAA funds to buy the airport land.
- No exposure to aviation if Young Eagles gone.
- Not accepting FAA money will stop business going there. Litigation cost too much money to close RHV
 if challenged by airport & FAA.
- Lead exposure from air pollution—can't be brought to San Martin if this is an issue.
- Once the airport is gone, you can't bring it back. No new airports are being built.
- Airport sits on public land and more affordable housing should be provided, community centers, parks.

FAA gives an entitlement grant to the airport yearly of \$150,000. After the 3 to 2 vote to reallocate the airport, Supervisors agreed not to accept any more money from the FAA. If they accept the money, the uncertainty of the airport will continue after the 2031 lease is up. More discussions with San Martin Airport about the reality of Reid Hillview closing and relocating is needed. Tower, longer runway(s), etc. need to be discussed. Supervisors didn't accept the County Airport presenter's business plan to make airport self-sufficient.
