
### **POTUS VISIT**

On January 18th this year, I received an email from the Salinas Airport Admin office on the TFR that would be active on January 19th (see next page), spanning from KSFO all the way down past KMRY. As I started reading through this 9 page manifest of the TFR Radius Map, Facility Checklist for POTUS Visit, and the FAA "NTL Defense Airspace" document, I also received another email from my company, a flight school in Monterey, Salinas, and San Jose. All flights will be suspended from 1130 PST to 1615 PST as the risk of filing an IFR flight plan and being intercepted was not worth it (see TFR Pilot Interview Form on next page).


The US President's \$2,614 Per Minute Transportation System



More information from the Manifest that is very discouraging of VFR flying during this time:

- -Towers and ATC must monitor unidentified targets squawking 1200 or violating and rules of the TFR.
- -They must request local law enforcement to detain the pilot until the Secret Service Agent(s) arrive.
- -Pilots whole not adhere to the procedure may be intercepted, detained, and interviewed by law enforcement/security personnel.
- -The FAA may impose civil penalties and the suspension or revocation of airmen certificates.
- -The US government may pursue criminal charges under 49 USC Section 46307
- -May use deadly force on an aircraft that imposes an imminent security threat.

### DID YOU KNOW?



### The FAA Changes Aircraft Registration from 3 Years to 7 Years

Effective January 23, 2023, if your registration certificate expires after this date, the registration certificate will automatically be extended an additional 4 years. A new certificate with the new expiration date will be sent to you. Aircraft with an expired registration, airworthiness certification is considered ineffective. Without registration, the aircraft is not authorized for flight. Once registration is restored, the airworthiness certificate not having been surrendered, revoked or terminated would become effective again provided the aircraft is otherwise compliant with maintenance, inspections, and any other requirements for an effective airworthiness. If you have further questions please contact an airworthiness inspector through your nearest Flight Standards District Office. -FAA

### 2023 ATMOSPHERIC RIVER

Now the TFR I mentioned before was all because of the disastrous storm that blew through California to end 2022 and greet is in 2023. A few years back, the wind storm that came through made sure everyone built new fences on their properties that could last another 20 years, hopefully.

This was very different. The ocean basically got sucked up into the clouds and dumped all the rain we've been begging for the past 2 years, and let it all go in 2 weeks. There were threats that Monterey would turn into an island if the Salinas River overflowed like it did in 1995 (hearsay for me, I was born in '98).

By now you've seen the videos online of pilots flying over the previously dry Salinas River forming new curves from Arroyo Seco all the way down to Moss Landing. What I do expect to see every time it rains, is Carr Lake in Salinas filled up with water, as it was naturally intended to do; In case you were wondering why there are fields directly in the middle of Salinas.

### **IS SPECIAL VFR SAFE?**

When sitting at my desk at the Monterey Airport, I feel like I've looked out the window many times asking myself, "Are they going VFR??"

The Monterey Bay is tricky with low, thin ceilings, requiring IFR capable aircraft and pilots alike. While there were lulls in the rain, when is it a good time to go out and check out the scenery? I recently spoke with Monterey County Sheriff Mike Fritsche who flys the county Cessna 206 for various mission helping other agencies. He stated his minimum for this mission was 3,000 ft ceilings, and once he got up to Greenfield, he could see straight under the clouds at 2,500 ft all the way to the ocean.

What if the ceiling is lower than 3000 ft? What about 800 ft? One the one special VFR departure flight I did go on, the biggest lesson I learned was that a request for SVFR should only happen when you are very familiar with the terrain.
