The North American Aviation T-6

Texan is a single-engine two-place advanced trainer was the classroom for most of the Allied pilots who flew in World War II. Pilots of the United States Army Air Forces (USAAF), United States Navy used it as a trainer into the 1970's. Called the SNJ by the Navy and the Harvard by the British Royal Air Force, the advanced trainer AT-6 was designed as a transition trainer between basic trainers and first-line tactical aircraft. It was redesignated T-6 in 1948



On a clear day at the Watsonville Airport, this T-6 was breaking the quiet of the sleepy airport. It was impossible to not look up to see what plane was buzzing around. It was even more impossible to ignore approaching the pilot/owner when he stopped at the fuel island to gas up. Mona, Petra, and Jeanne got the pleasure of seeing the T-6 up close and even inside the cockpit.

Joby Aviation will receive Toyota's manufacturing expertise and assistance funding the development of its electric vertical take-off and landing vehicle. (VTOL). Investors include SPARX Group, Intel Capital, Capricorn Investment Group, JetBlue Technology Ventures, Toyota AI Ventures, AME Cloud Ventures, Baillie Gifford and Global Oryx.

The plan is to develop an airborne vehicle for commercial air taxi service. Joby Aviation is a Santa Cruz county company with roots in Bonny Doon, California and founded in 2009 with offices located in San Carlos and Marina. CEO and founder, Joe Ben Bevirt embodies the values of Santa Cruz County... "radical innovation, environmental consciousness, and connection to our stunning natural resources." "Our mission is to change lives by transforming the landscape of transportation. We've created a safer, faster and easier way to get around which is untethered from ground based infrastructure."

This aircraft will be able to fly up to 200 miles per hour on a 150 mile electric charge. It will hold four passengers and a pilot and have zero emission, be 100 times quieter than conventional aircrafts during takeoff and landing, and nearly silent in flight. With Toyota's expertise in manufacturing and engineering, the realization of an air taxi (similar to an Uber or Lyft per-trip passenger pricing) will be a reality soon.

Hazardous Inflight Weather Advisory Service (HIWAS) discontinued

As part of the FAA's efforts to modernize and streamline service delivery, Flight Service will discontinue the Hazardous Inflight Weather Advisory Service (HIWAS) in the contiguous United States, effective January 8, 2020.

HIWAS is a legacy service with a continuous recording of inflight weather advisories broadcast over a limited network of WORs that provided pilots with meteorological information related to hazardous weather.

The FAA instituted Flight Information System Broadcast, FIS-B, as a replacement for this system that provides a broader range of aeronautical information products often in a graphical format, which is not available via HIWAS. For pilots who choose not to equip their aircraft with this new technology, a Flight Service Specialist is still available over a radio outlet.
