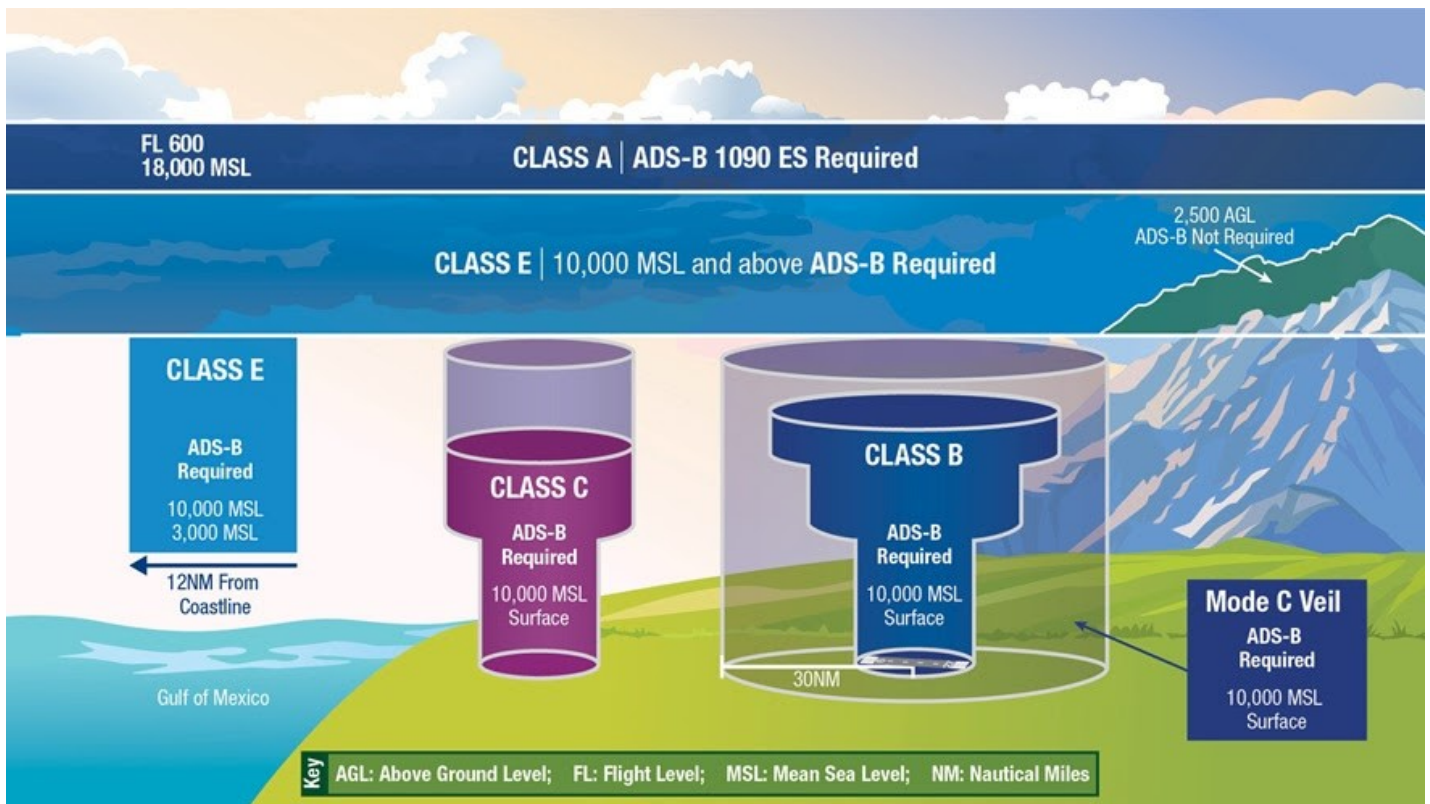
New ADS-B Rules

at risk of cancellation.
We need your help!
National Procedure Assessment (NPA)
Please comment now.***

This email is to advise you of the potential for an Instrument Flight Procedure cancellation within Watsonville's airspace and to request you assist FAA Facility Management and NATCA as they collaborate to seek concurrence/objection to the proposal for cancellation.

Since the year 2000, as the National Airspace System (NAS) transitioned to a NextGen NAS, the number of flight procedures in the NAS has quadrupled.

The complexity and cost to the FAA of maintaining these procedures is not sustainable. As a result, the National Procedure Assessment (NPA) Program was initiated. Under the NPA, MITRE completed an exercise to identify underutilized procedures that the FAA may consider as candidates for cancellation.

The WATSONVILLE VOR-A is a candidate for cancellation.

The Municipal Airport has expressed a position that this IAP should not be canceled. Our desire is to that you join our objection for cancellation by sending same to the following email:

Please reference Watsonville Municipal airport and the VOR-A in your email and cc airport@cityofwatsonville.org.

We ask that you submit comments within 30 days. Again, strong collaboration between Management and NATCA on any comments is highly beneficial.

We look forward to your response, and please let us know if we can be of any assistance.

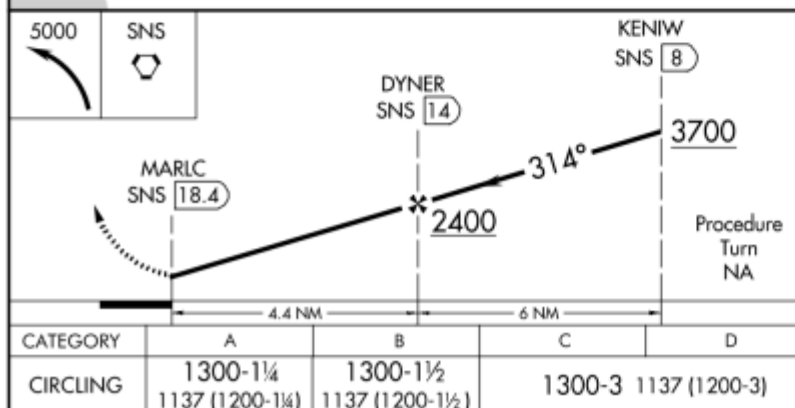
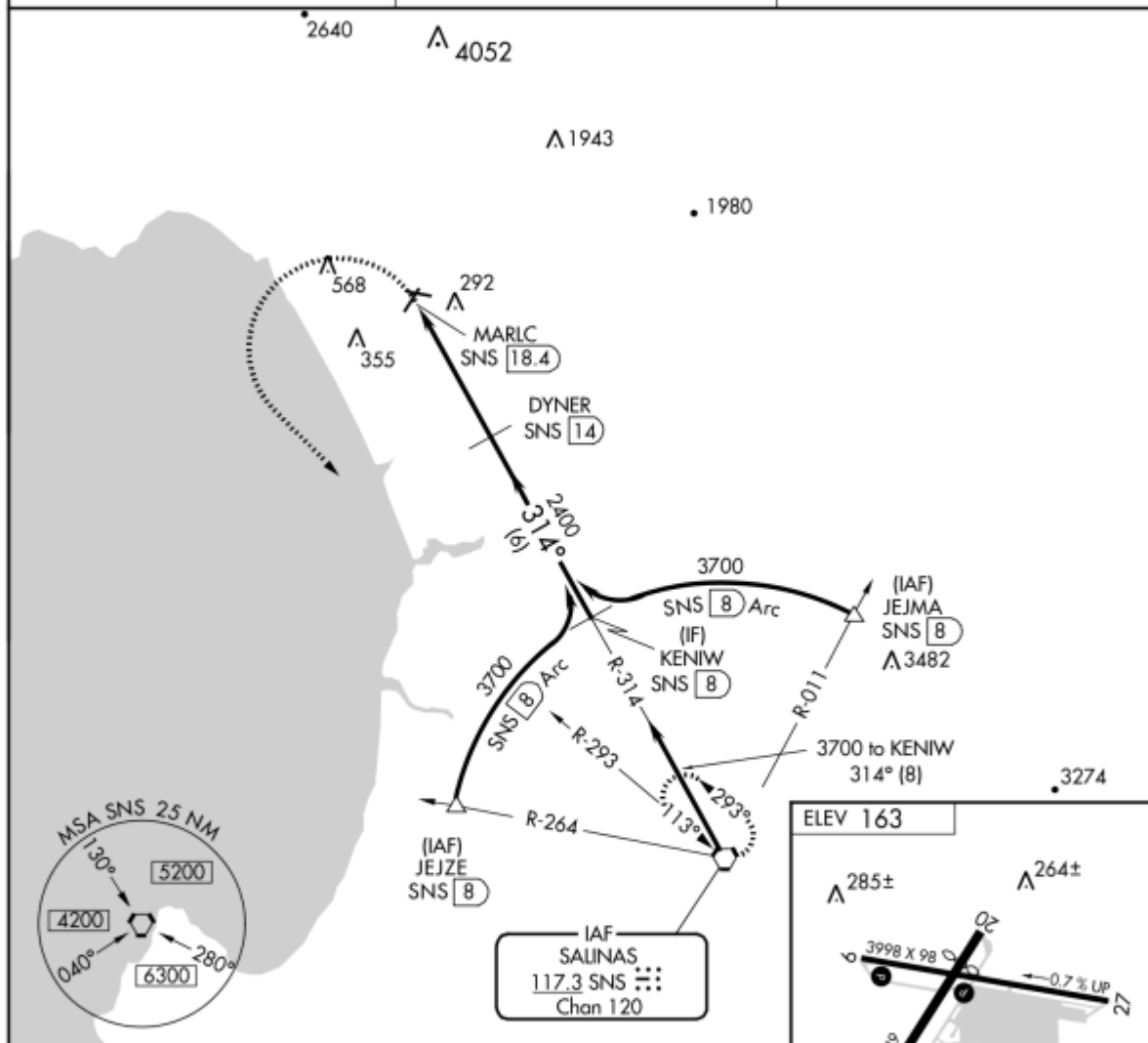

In memory of Earline Arnold's (Monterey Bay 99) husband Deryck "Dick" Nuckton

Sept. 23, 1931 - Dec. 22, 2019 Monterey

Dick Nuckton was born in Castle Hayne, North Carolina. He passed away peacefully in his Monterey home of Parkinson's Disease that he lived with for over 20 years.

1949 Graduated from New Hanover High School.

1952 Graduated from Stanford University in Biological Sciences.

1956 Graduated from UCSF Dental School with a specialty in Orthodontics.

1956-1958 Served his country in the United States Army.

1958 Settled in Monterey where he practiced orthodontics.

He was a Diplomat of the American Board of Orthodontics. Dick was one of the founders of Monterey Peninsula Winery.

Dick held a commercial pilot certificate and a Flight Instructor's Certificate (for visual and instrument ratings) and flew many times from Pacific to Atlantic and from Mexico to Canada.

How to describe Dick Nuckton? He was professionally an orthodontist. He made many girls and boys around the Monterey Peninsula have much more beautiful smiles. He was also a fisherman, a winemaker, an inventor, a pilot, a father, a teacher, a world traveler and a husband. Married three times, first to the mother of his children, Carole Ann Nuckton, whom he met in college; second to Betsy Brown of Pebble Beach; and third and finally to Earline Arnold.

He and his wife Earline travelled extensively, and had visited all seven continents. They had gone around the world twice and to Africa eight times. They loved travelling by train.

A memorial gathering will be held for Dick at The Pacheco Club, 602 Abrego Street, Monterey, CA. 93940 on Saturday, January 18th from 3pm to 5pm. Upcoming Webinars Will Highlight Changes and Enhancements to FAA Knowledge Testing Notice Number: NOTC9885

The FAA awarded a new airman knowledge testing contract call the Airman Certificate Testing Service (ACTS). The contract is a comprehensive, best-practices approach aimed at enhancing the overall quality of FAA Airman Knowledge Testing. As a result, there are several enhancements going into effect on January 13, 2020.

To help educate and inform all people who take, or will take an FAA Knowledge Test on or after January 13, 2020, the FAA will host 4 Webinars in support of the new testing system. The Webinar will cover the need for all persons taking a Knowledge Test to have an FAA Tracking Number (FTN), the removal of the embossed seal on a Knowledge Test Report, and the use of Airman Certification Standard's codes on some Knowledge Test Reports.
