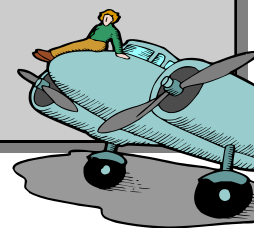

Betty Ardell ("Dell") Hinn, 91, passed away in her sleep on May 10 after a very loving, family-oriented Mother's Day Celebration.

Dell was a charter member of the Monterey Bay 99s and prior to that was a charter member of the Santa Clara Valley Chapter. She remained very involved well into her 80s. In 2007, she moved to the Reno, Nevada area to be near her family. She was born on March 11, 1919, in Oakland and moved to Salinas in 1950.

In 1996 the Monterey Bay Chapter held a party in Morgan Hill to celebrate Dell's 50 years of flying and 10,000 flying hours.

Dell learned to fly in 1945, taught by Marion Barnick. She flew many Powder Puff Derbies, including one with her daughter Carol in 1955 and was the only grandmother/granddaughter team with Gail in 1975. Dell transferred her membership to the Monterey Chapter when they were chartered in August 1965.



Friends from the Monterey Bay and Santa Clara Valley Chapters often met in Hollister. In 1975 Jackie Petty, Nancy Rodgers and Dell organized a picnic and spot landing contest. With entry fees placed in a large piggy bank, name tags in the shape of pigs, the annual HAM (Hollister Air meet) began with 28 entries. First prize was a canned ham! It became a traditional well attended yearly event.

Del started the Wings for Direct Relief Foundation. Ninety-Nines would bring (fly) donated medical supplies from all across the United States working their way to Santa Barbara where they were moved by ship to needy countries.

She was a Charter Pilot and a Transportation Officer for the Monterey Sheriff's Department. She was famous for baking snickerdoodle cookies and sharing them with the prisoners she was transporting.

Dell is survived by her daughter, Carol Champlin; her son, Jay Hauk; her step-daughter, Gail Gitt; her step-son, George Hinn; her grandchildren, Teri Moore, Denise Aiello, Jaylene Berry, Darren Champlin and Gail Dallas; her step-grandchildren, Ryan and Jeff Hinn and their families. She was preceded in death by her husband of 37 years, Dr. George J. Hinn.

She will be greatly missed.

Duties of Officers:

The Chairman shall preside at all Chapter meetings and enforce due observance of the Constitution and By-Laws; see that all officers and members of committees perform their respective duties as enjoined by the laws of the organization; receive and put all motions; appoint all officers and committees, unless otherwise specified; inspect and announce the results of the balloting or other votes by the Chapter; preside at all the meetings of the Board of Directors; and perform such other duties as usually appertain to the office or as otherwise directed by the members in meeting. In case of the absence of any officer at any meeting, the Chairman shall appoint a member in good standing to act for such absent officer.

The Vice Chairman shall assist the Chairman in the performance of her duties; preside at Chapter meetings or meetings of the Board of Directors in case of the absence, resignation or removal from office of the Chairman.

The Secretary shall keep in a book for that purpose, an accurate account of all transactions of the Chapter meetings and meetings of the Board of Directors; write all communications; file all papers and documents pertaining to Chapter transactions, issue all notices as directed by the members in meeting or the Chairman; and perform such other duties as usually appertain to the office.

The Treasurer shall receive all monies due the Chapter, giving a receipt for same. She shall pay out the same, only on authorization of the Board of Directors or as directed by the members in meeting. She shall give, when requested by the Chairman, a statement in writing of monies on hand and shall at the June meeting, make a financial report of the year's receipts and expenditures.

CANCELLATION: JUNE 21, 2010


The US Open Pebble Beach Golf Tournament is held at Pebble Beach approximately every 10 years. The daily ticket sales are 37,500. There will be approximately 11,000 volunteers and vendors working at the event each day. These numbers do not include media and golfers. This event will generate a significant increase in air traffic at the Monterey Airport.

Starting the afternoon of June 13, 2010 and continuing through the morning of June 21, 2010, we anticipate that the amount of air traffic arriving and departing Monterey will likely double. During our busiest times, Monterey Tower will be unable to authorize practice approaches. Arrival delays are likely to occur during this timeframe. All VFR aircraft can expect to be held outside Charlie airspace as necessary to accommodate increased IFR volume. IFR departures may expect re-routes as the FAA works to manage the excess traffic in an effort to minimize delays.

As the airport fills up with aircraft, it may be necessary to close runway 28R/10L to park aircraft on the runway. This will be a last resort should all other parking areas be in use. Should this occur, all arrivals and departures will use the same runway (28L/10R) which may also cause additional delays.

Monterey Tower is asking all pilots to be aware of this event and to please consider using other area airports if you are not regularly scheduled into Monterey, not based at Monterey, or do not absolutely need to land/depart Monterey Airport between June 13 and June 21, 2010.

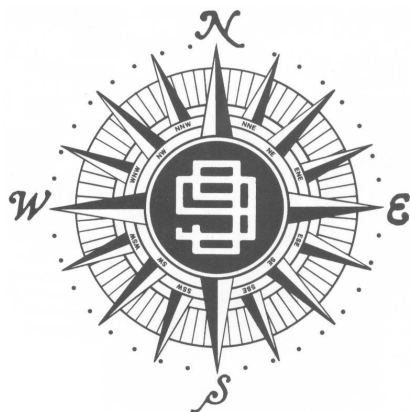
