SANTA ROSA NINETY-NINES Aviation Scholarship

Purpose: To provide funding to be used for a specific rating or certification to further the recipient's pursuit of a career in aviation.

Award Amount: \$3,000

Eligibility: Any women at least 17 years of age, holding at minimum a current private license, a current medical, and a current flight review. Must reside within 150 miles of the Charles M. Schulz Sonoma County Airport, be eligible for the rating being applied for (i.e.: number of flight hours required, rating required, medical required), and have completed any written requirements for the rating before funds are dispersed.

Application Due: May 1, 2018

Airport Security...we need your help!

Recent break-ins/thefts; Resultant airport actions

As some of you may be aware over the last few months commercial leasehold airport properties, commercial properties along Aviation Way, Restaurant employee vehicles and even the Municipal Airport's approach lighting contractor have been the victims of break-ins resulting in thefts of personal items, equipment and tools. At last count the estimated value exceeds tens of thousands of dollars.

We've reached out to the above listed victims, filed police reports and discussed plans and actions to prevent and mitigate further crimes.

We are reaching out to Airport tenants and users to: (1) **Solicit specific actions** to improve security and (2) **Set expectations of future actions** to shore up our security efforts.

See something Say something.....reporting makes a difference.

It has been said many times, but given the current challenges it bears repeating:

Don't share gate codes.

If you see anything amiss, out of place, unlocked or unattended please be sure to inform the airport office.

Be sure doors are locked.

Lookout for your neighbors, don't tailgate onto the field and don't allow others to tailgate.

Actions we are taking.

In association with Watsonville Police Neighborhood Services Division the airport will host a "Neighborhood Watch Meeting". The airport is inviting Airport and Aviation Way tenants (airside and landside) to join WPD for a security and safeguarding property Q&A session. Look for details soon.

Within the next few weeks Watsonville Police Department will add the Municipal Airport's ramp to the daily surveillance patrols. We'll provide WPD patrol vehicles with automatic gate openers and airport grid maps. Be on the lookout for Watsonville's finest and if you have a chance be sure to welcome them to the field.

Finally the airport will be bringing an additional First Alarm security patrol to the current patrol cycle.

The Municipal Airport is committed to safeguarding our assets and your investment in General Aviation's ongoing viability. We will continue to rely on our resources and the tenants to stay vigilant.
