


Alice purchased a 1963 Mooney, a complex, high-performance airplane that she still owns.

It is either to be used by the recipient to obtain her private pilot license or to obtain an advanced rating to further her pursuit of a career in aviation.

The Monterey Bay Chapter also offers registration fee awards to chapter members and/or Student Pilot members. The awards are to be used to attend either the next scheduled Fall or Spring Southwest Section meeting OR International Conference. The awards cover the registration fee only. The award application is due two months prior to the scheduled meeting registration deadline of December 30th.

Friday night's dinner was Bonnie & Clyde Dinner Theater (above is stage and setting for the play). Thursday's lunch was at a Japanese restaurant (like Benihana's). Saturday's awards banquet entertainment was "Fly About" a documentary of a young female pilot that flies around the island of Australia with her newly certificated pilot-father and several new pilot friends.

The seminars that were offered were ADS-B, AEMSf Scholarship Secrets Revealed!, Blind Flight, and Drones in the sky: Separating Fact from Fear. Blind Flight was about the strange and courageous story of the development of instrument flying. The Drones talk was a synopsis of UAVs (unmanned aerial vehicles) in FAA uncontrolled airspace. Governing laws, rules, guidelines and basic information about the different types of UAV operators were introduced.

Notes from the business meeting...

- At the business meeting there were 85 attendees from 26 chapters (including two chapters out-of-state). The SWS has 300 new members.
- Whenever there are seminars, try to set it up so participants can earn WINGS credit.

NOTICE TO WATSONVILLE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT USERS

PENDING AIRPORT RUNWAY 9-27 AND TAXIWAY CLOSURES

PHASE ONE: NOVEMBER 5th - 16th, 2018

Posted October 25, 2018



As a follow-up to the September 28, 2018 notice Phase One of the Runway Rehabilitation will commence November 5, 2018 and is estimated to conclude on November 16th, 2018. During this ten (10) working day period Runway 9-27 will be **closed from 0730 to 1630 local** each weekday.

Impacts: During Phase 1 construction there may be intermittent closures of the Alpha and Charlie intersection impacting operations on Runway Two Zero. Such impact may require "Back Taxi" operations for Runway 20.

Construction is scheduled to begin at 0730 hrs and conclude by 1630 hrs each weekday during construction. Weather depending, it's possible the Phase 1 work may conclude early.

Airport Operations will be directing/escorting construction vehicles as required and monitor the UNICOM/CTAF during this period. There are no other planned restrictions during construction and the airport will remain open.




