NOTICE TO WATSONVILLE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT USERS PENDING AIRPORT RUNWAY AND TAXIWAY CLOSURES PHASE ONE: MID OCTOBER 2018 to MID NOVEMBER 2018 PHASE TWO: MID JULY 2019 to END AUGUST 2019

Posted September 28, 2018

In accordance with FAA Order 5100.38D Section 3-20 (Consultation with Airport Users) this notice is provided. Watsonville Municipal requested Airport Improvement Program Grant funds for Crack Repair, Slurry and Seal; Marking refresh and Signage - on Runways 2 and 20 and adjoining taxiways in December 2017. The AIP request seeks to improve runway integrity, strength, traction coefficients, extend runway operational life and improve visual cues during all phases of operations.

Project Dates: Construction consists of two (2) phases. Phase 1 (approximately 35 working days) begins October and concludes in November of 2018. Phase 2 (approximately 40 working days) begins early July 2019 and concludes end August 2019.

Impacts: During Phase 1 construction expect intermittent closures of Runway Two-Two Zero and Nine-Two Seven, Taxiways Alpha, portions of Charlie (east of 2/20). During Phase 2 construction expect closure of Runway Two-Two Zero, Taxi ways Alpha, portions of Charlie (east of 2/20), Delta and Echo. Construction closures are staged; i.e. at differing times portions of a taxiway will be closed while other portions will be open to traffic.

Additionally for at least seven (7) to ten (10) working days during Phase 2 both runways will be closed due to intersection specific (Runway 2-20 and Runway 9-27 and Runway 2-20 and Taxiway Charlie) construction. The closure periods for the July 2019 construction will be posted thirty days in advance.

Construction is scheduled to begin at 0700 hrs and conclude by 1700 hrs each weekday during construction. Weather depending, it's likely at least one weekend will be impacted by the closure.

Hello WEACT Supporters!

On Thursday, 9/6/18, WEACT participated in the 2018 Bay Area Urban Shield YELLOW COMMAND Full Scale Exercise. WEACT operated under the coordination of the Santa Cruz County Emergency Operated

ations Center (SCC EOC). The overall exercise was organized by the CA OES, Office of Emergency Services.

Throughout the exercise, WEACT flew 6 missions for the SCC EOC, including reconnaissance flights to observe simulated damage to the Pajaro levee, to overfly highway 129 to check for landslide damage and provide information about possible alternative traffic routes, and to observe conditions of the Santa Cruz city roads to facilitate evacuation routing.

WEACT's participation in the 2018 YELLOW COMMAND exercise was a great success! WEACT demonstrated their operational capabilities to the county, solidifying a working relationship we have been developing for the last couple years.

WEACT would like to thank the 23 amazing, dedicated, enthusiastic volunteers who came out to support WEACT for the exercise:

The recipient may not be a current or former member of The Ninety-Nines or of a group within The Ninety-Nines.

Recognizes support provided to The Ninety-Nines by an individual (male or female, living or deceased) or an organization. The contribution may have occurred in the past or present, as a single action or a series of events.

An individual (male or female, living or deceased), or an organization. The recipient may not be a current or former member of The Ninety-Nines or of a group within The Ninety-Nines

Submissions of Nominations

Nominations for the Award of Achievement, Award of Merit, and the George Palmer Putnam Award may be submitted by any individual or group within The Ninety- Nines.

The nomination should be in the form of a one-page letter and up to three additional pages of substantiating material. The name, address and phone number of the nominee or the nominee's next of kin, if the nominee is deceased, should be included.

The nomination should be complete, but concise, details justifying the award to the nominee which such background information as considered pertinent, and any other relevant information, that would assist the Awards Committee.

Nominations from previous years may be resubmitted.

Nominations should be sent to the Ninety -Nines Headquarters to the attention of the Awards Committee.

Nominations may be submitted by electronic transmission (fax or email) or by post. The nomination must be received on or before the nomination deadline.




