NOTICE TO WATSONVILLE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT USERS AIRPORT RUNWAY 9-27 and TAXIWAY REHABILITATION

PHASE THREE BEGINS OCTOBER 14th

To: Watsonville Municipal Airport Tenants and Users From: Rayvon Williams, Municipal Airport Director

Subj: NOTICE TO AIRPORT USERS; AIRPORT IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

As previously communicated Watsonville Municipal Airport provided notification of pending construction funded by an Airport Improvement Program Grant.

Rehabilitation of Runway 9-27, taxiways Bravo and Charlie (east of runway 2-20) commences October 11th and, weather permitting, concludes October 25th.

Repair of Runway 2-20 lighting sub-surface wiring and transformer upgrade commences October 28th and, weather permitting, concludes November 1st.

See this **graphic** for rehabilitation and repair schedule details.

The projects will improve runway operating conditions and include new markings for Runways 9-27, connector taxiway Bravo, parallel taxiway Charlie and repair thirty year old wiring infrastructure supporting the primary runway.

Impacts: Runway and certain taxiways will be closed to aircraft at various times during this period. Runway **9-27 will be closed as noted.**

There will be some impact to parallel taxi Charlie and Runway 2-20 requiring back taxi during this time.

Northern hangars (Foxtrot thru Lima), Eastern Hangars (Alfa thru Echo) and Corporate hangars use caution taxing to runway.

B-17 Nine-O-Nine





The above photo is of the Nine-O-Nine, the Collings Foundation B17 Flying Fortress that crashed in Connecticut on October 2, 2019.

The pilot reported engine trouble on take-off prior to the crash that killed 7 of the 13 people on board. This propeller-driven, 4 engine, plexiglass nose, bristling machine guns, 1945 WWII bomber helped smash the Nazi war machine. Since 1982, the NTSB has investigated 21 accidents involving WWII-era bombers. They resulted in 23 deaths. Three of the accidents involved B-17Bs, not counting the one that just crashed. There are only 9 B-17s actively flying now.

Politicians are asking the National Transportation Safety Board to look at the inspection and maintenance requirements on vintage planes and whether they need to be more rigorous. FAA spokesperson said that if an issue is discovered during the investigation that might apply to the fleet, the agency will take appropriate action.

Fall 2019 Southwest Section Conference Report October 3-5 San Luis Obispo, CA

120 delegates were at the business meeting which represented 28 chapters.

- Cathy Prudhomme (Houston chapter) was the international representative. She reported that there was a 25% increase in membership in the last two years which was due to the professional marketing that was used. The challenge is to retain members through continued renewal of membership.
- There were 100 new members since last November. The 99s now have 6,076 members.
- The 2020 international conference will be in Jordon, probably in May (due to extreme heat in July).
- There was some discussion over financial shortage to the Penny Nagy Center. Since there was unallocated money in the account, it was voted upon to put up to \$1400 to the Center to cover all necessary expenses.
- Santa Monica was the site of the first Powder Puff/Air Race. Recently they had a reenactment of the race. That airport is in jeopardy (rumors say) so the members there came up with an ingenious plan. They are trying to preserve the compass rose as a historic landmark thus possibly using that to also save the airport. They mentioned that each chapter should look into the possibility of preserving their compass rose using the historic landmark nomination. A side note is to put the date when the compass rose was painted for documentation.
- Eco-aviation.org (green aviation) The first wave of electric aircraft will be getting FAA and EASA certification in 2019-2020. So airplanes and VTOLs will be trending toward quiet and zero-emissions over the next few years. Mission statement: To promote awareness and early-adoption of the new zero-emissions, electric and other sustainable aviation technologies including sustainable airport infrastructure technologies. Located on Santa Monica Airport.
- The 2020 winter workshop will be on January 24 in Palmdale. The Antelope Valley Chapter is hosting it. Contact Lynn Hsia @ (626) 484-2898; lkhsia@aol.com for details.
- NIFA report—October 28-Nov. 2 @ Embry Riddle in Arizona. Virginia Harmer needs help for the Safecon. She also needs people who can use the iPad and Go-Pro during the competition.
- New editor is needed for the Southwesterly.
- Big stir occurred over the lack of not having the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Next year the international conference will be on the Queen Mary—dates July 8-12th. Early registration ensures outside window. In additional to the planned tours, the Queen Mary has 10 additional tours the ship provides.
- November 2, 2019 is the 90th anniversary of the International Organization of the Ninety-Nines.



BAY AREA WIDE DISASTER EXERCISE 26 October 2019

(Municipal Airport posts this notice on behalf of W.E.A.C.T)

Watsonville Emergency Airlift Command Team is participating in a Bay Area wide exercise on 26 October to exercise communications between airports, procedures, and local interfaces.

Expected time is from ~9am to ~3pm. Scenario is a major earthquake in the San Francisco area with resulting impacts around the Bay Area.

We need volunteer pilots/planes and ground crew (ramp control and material handling) to try out our processes and to fly missions around the Bay Area.

If you participated in last year's exercise and got Disaster Service Worker (DSW) certification and a badge from Santa Cruz County, you will be covered with insurance as this is a sanctioned exercise. CalDART

CalDART, The California DART Network, is building a statewide network of local Disaster Airlift Response Teams (DARTs) to improve California's disaster resilience in the face of earthquakes, floods and similar events which impair regional surface transportation. DARTs utilize a common operating model and are located at airports around the state. CalDART is a wholly owned subsidiary of the The California Pilot Association - Membership in CalDART includes membership in CalPilots.

WEACT and CalDART

WEACT is separate from CalDART and CalPilots but many of our leadership are CalDART members also and are participating in planning for the October 26th CalDART exercise. WEACT leadership recommends but does not require CalDART membership. CalDART membership is required to participate in DART exercises but not in WEACT only exercises where we are only interfacing with Santa Cruz County or City of Watsonville.

Darlene Kelly Advanced Certificate/Rating Flight Training Scholarship

One \$2,000 award to help fund training for the Instrument, Commercial, Multi-Engine, or any Flight Instructor certificate. Applicant must (1) be a member of the Southwest Section of the Ninety-Nines, (2) have a current medical, and (3) have a private pilot license. There is a 90 day limit to apply funds towards training.

Application deadline - December 31st.

The Fullerton Chapter 99s Sylvia Paoli Scholarship-

The Fullerton Chapter of the Ninety-Nines is partnering with the San Diego Chapter to give this award.

The application process will utilize the Darlene Kelly Advanced Certificate/Rating Flight Training Scholarship process and two winners will be chosen: One for the SD 99s award and another will receive a \$1,974 award - the Paoli Scholarship, in honor of Sylvia Paoli (and the founding year of the Fullerton Chapter 99s)..

Each award may be used to help fund training for the Instrument, Commercial, Multi-Engine, or any Flight Instructor certificate. Applicants must:

- (1) be a Southwest Section Ninety-Nine (CA, AZ, NV, UT, HI)
- (2) have a current medical
- (3) have a private pilot certificate.


